## Summary of the First Stake in the Nation Forum (SNF1)

The First Stake in the Nation Forum (SNF) was held on Saturday, 13 January 2018, at Kairaba Beach Hotel, preceded on 11 January 2018 by a Remittance Technical Roundtable hosted by Central Bank of The Gambia. SNF1 was led by the President of The Republic of The Gambia, H.E. Mr Adama Barrow, and it was used to launch the Gambia Diaspora Strategy (GDS), the Gambia Diaspora Directorate (GDD), and a ministerial report on 'Curbing Irregular Migration through Sustainable Livelihoods'.

The keynote speakers in the opening plenary session who delivered statements prior to the President's SNF address were: Prof. Gibril Faal, Director of GK Partners & MSDG Project, H.E. Dr Marion Weichelt Krupski, Switzerland Ambassador to The Gambia, Ms. Fumiko Nagano, Chief of Mission, International Organization for Migration, Hon. Dr Isatou Touray, Minister of Trade, Industry, Regional Integration and Employment, Hon. Henry Gomez, Minister of Youth and Sports, and Hon. Ousainu A.N.M. Darboe, Minister of Foreign Affairs, International cooperation and Gambians Abroad. The MSDG Focal Point at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs was the Secretary/Announcer at the opening session.

There were seven parallel thematic workshops on: Migrant Returnees from Libya and Niger; Human Rights & Access to Justice for All; Information & Communication Technology; Agriculture & Agribusiness; Education and Employment; Health & Medical Services; Infrastructure & Industrial Development. The discussants and moderators were leading experts and practitioners, based in Gambia and the diaspora.

The thematic workshop on Infrastructure & Industrial Development was presided by the Hon. Bai Lamin Jobe, Minister of Transport, Works and Infrastructure. The closing session was an interview and discussion session, co-hosted by GK Partners and the Gambia Radio and Television Services (GRTS), as a special edition of the GRTS flagship current affairs programme 'Face the Nation'. The panel comprised: H.E. Vice President Mrs Fatoumata Jallow Tambajang, Hon. Omar Jallow, Minister of Agriculture, Hon. Dr Isatou Touray, Minister of Trade, Industry, Regional Integration and Employment, Mr Alieu Momar Njai, Chairman of the Independent Electoral Commission, Mr James Bahoum, MSDG Project Diaspora Adviser, and Mr Saihou Saïdy Leigh, Gambian Diaspora Economist.

SNF1 was presided by the President, attended by the Vice President, ten cabinet ministers, Secretary-General and Head of the Civil Service, Speaker of the National Assembly, Chair of the Independent Electoral Commission, Parliamentarians, Heads of Security Services, Ambassadors and Heads of Missions, Permanent Secretaries, Business and Civil Society Leaders, Academics, Diaspora Professionals and Experts, and Irregular Migrant Returnees. (The 400 delegates included 200 irregular migrant returnees from Libya and Niger). The media partners were Gambia Radio and Television Services (GRTS) and Eye Africa TV. SNF1 was livestreamed and watched by 9,000+ people, reported as GRTS headline news, and the closing session was broadcast as a special edition of GRTS's 'Face the Nation' programme.

President Adama Barrow used his first 'Stake in the Nation Address', to declare the diaspora as the Eighth Region of The Gambia. The title of the President's address was 'Attaining Progress in the New Gambia', in which he highlighted two major challenges and two major opportunities. He stated that:

***"We must be vigilant against the problem of a dysfunctional public sector.....we must be vigilant against the problem of corrupt practices.....we must be vigilant for the opportunity of infrastructure-led development.....we must be vigilant for the opportunity of diaspora-development"***.
