Recognition of MSDG as an Innovative and Impactful **Diaspora-Led Technical Cooperation Programme**

The 2018 post-dictatorship Gambia National Development Plan (NDP) recognised MSDG as the third 'Flagship Project of the NDP Strategic Priorities'. In his introduction of the NDP, the Minister of Finance stated: "My particular thanks go to the members of all the thirteen (13) Thematic Working Groups (TWGs) who worked diligently over many months to prepare the plan, as well as the Migration and Sustainable Development in The Gambia project (MSDG/GKP) for its contribution". MSDG is implemented by GK Partners, and has been supported by the Governments of Switzerland and The Gambia since 2017. The experience and empirical lessons learnt since 2017 make MSDG a suitable programme for feasible and viable scale-up and replication.



The Gambian Diaspora Strategy (GDS) produced by MSDG on behalf of the Government of The Gambia Government is older than the Global Compact on Migration (GCM), yet its provisions are remarkably similar to the GCM Objectives. This is partly due to the fact that MSDG incorporates globally accepted and emergent good practices on Migration, Diaspora and Development (MDD). MSDG is in compliance with all the 10 GCM Guiding Principles.

MSDG covers 11 of the 23 GCM Objectives, with emphasis on Objectives 1, 19, 20 and 23
