Institutionalising Diaspora in Development: MSDG4 Project Briefing (1 July 2024 to 30 June 2029)

The Gambia is a small country with big migration. Of a population of about 2.5 million, about 10 percent live abroad in the diaspora. The Gambia has the highest dependency on remittances in Africa. The Migration and Sustainable Development in The Gambia (MSDG) Project was established in January 2017 as an innovative diaspora-led Technical Assistance (TA) and Technical Cooperation Programme (TCP). After a peer-review process, in August 2023, the MSDG Project was recognised as an example of global innovation and good practice by the United Nations Migration Agency (IOM), and included in the global portal of 'Repository of Practice'. MSDG remains one of the very few diaspora-led TA/TCP in the world. In May 2024, the World Economic Forum (WEF) published an IOM/GKP blog on the MSDG Project entitled: 'How The Gambia offers a roadmap for enhancing diaspora engagement'.

MSDG aims to "enhance and expand the role of the Gambian diaspora in national development, as the Eighth Region of the country [through] diaspora participation in socioeconomic development policy and practice, and institutionalised engagement". MSDG is a feasible and efficient mechanism for delivering sustainable and inclusive outputs and impacts on Migration, Diaspora and Development, through innovation, implementation of global good practice and maintenance of professional and operational excellence.

The first MSDG activity on 11 February 2017 was the 'Induction and Training Workshop for New Cabinet Ministers', held a week after the formation of a new democratic government, after 22 years of dictatorship. The early achievements included the production of the first-ever Gambian diaspora policy and strategy which were fully incorporated in the post-dictatorship National Development Plan (NDP).

GK Partners (GKP) as a social enterprise developed, co-finances and is the implementing agency of the MSDG Project. *It registered as a company in England and Wales in 2004.* It is also registered with Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs (HMRC), and the *European Union List of Private Law Bodies* for service contracts. For effective delivery of the MSDG Project, *in 2019, GKP was registered in The Gambia in the name of GK Partners (Global) Limited.* It is also registered with the Gambia Revenue Authority (GRA) and Social Security and Housing Finance Corporation (SSFHC).

GKP as a social enterprise generates income through commercial contracts, technical assistance and service level assignments, and programme grants. In turn, it provides pro bono support, in-kind technical expertise, and project co-finance to a range of public and community benefit programmes undertaken by civil society, public sector, international development, social enterprise and academic organisations and institutions. GKP is a *signatory to the 2006 Ten Principles of the UN Global Compact* for responsible business, and *Member of the UNGC Network* in the UK. GKP is a *Member of CPD Certification Service*.
